Pastor's Pen Epiphany Moments

"In the year that King Uzziah died I saw the Lord sitting upon a throne, high and lifted up; and his train filled the temple." (Isaiah 6:1)

Can you remember a time when you were routinely having your devotions, or were sitting in a worship service, or perhaps contemplating the word of God in prayer, and suddenly you were made aware that you were in God's presence? You knew that you were actually in conversation with God himself, and after momentary embarrassment at being caught so off guard, you were quickly transformed into a true time of Epiphany.

A grieving Isaiah, going about his routine priestly duties in the temple, was overcome by an unexpected revelation of God's presence. He was transfixed by a vision of heavenly worship. He knew he was in the presence of a holy God. He could only stand there, out of place and unworthy, until, in answer to his dilemma, God reached out, cleansed him, and included him. That day he knew with Habakkuk that "the Lord was in his holy temple, let all the earth keep silence before him."

A lonely John, exiled to the island of Patmos, "alone" on the Lord's Day, was overcome by a booming voice coming from behind him like the sound of a trumpet. He turned to look and fell at the feet of the risen Lord, because he felt strangely out of place. Encouraging him not to be afraid, the Lord laid his hand upon him and raised him up, and then called him into the heavenlies where he entered into the great worship scene before the throne of God.

"Holy, holy is the Lord of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory." Now and again we need to have our eyes lifted from the routines of our life and to look again at things from the perspective of eternity, to be reminded that we worship and serve a holy God before whom we can only confess our unworthiness - who loves us so much that he overwhelms us with his gracious presence. Thank God for his gift of Epiphany moments!

From the President

Happy New Year! I hope you had a blessed Christmas with family and friends. I hope that you participated in the special Advent activities at the church – the Advent meals and services, the Advent online devotions, Christmas tree decorating, caroling in the neighborhood, Santa's workshop at the Birmingham YMCA, and the Christmas Eve and Christmas Day services. It was a very busy time and I want to thank all those who coordinated and participated in making everything happen. I know that God will use our talents and participation to accomplish his goals and to connect those outside the church to him. I am looking forward to experiencing the harvest.

January is going to be a busy time for the church. On January 8 we will have a Voter's Meeting to review and approve a budget for 2023. The 2023 proposed budget while very similar to the 2022 budget, has been modified to update a proposed minister's salary, more emphasis on outreach and member Bible study and fellowship activities.

The Call Committee will interview and rank between two and six seminary pastoral candidates. The committee will submit the ranking to the seminaries by March 1. By the end of March, we should know whether or not we matched with a candidate.

The board is planning several outreach activities. We are exploring the idea of a community yard sale hosted by the church in the spring or summer. We are planning English as a Second Language classes and also looking into a ministry to UAB students. With the help of the neighborhood association, we're also developing projects with the community around the church.

Involving church members in Bible study is another area the board is placing an emphasis on. WE are developing resources and will share those with the membership. Please be on the lookout for this information and participate in the studies offered.

I thank God for the dedicated members of the church who are working to connect people and themselves to Jesus. I look forward to what God has in store for us.

Worship Ministry Discipleship

Jesus spoke these words to Simon and his brother Andrew, who were fisherman, while he was passing alongside the sea of Galilee "Follow me, and I make you fishers of men." (Mark 1:17 ESV) They immediately left their nets and followed Jesus thus becoming his followers and disciples. Raising the question: Just who are His disciples? Disciples are Christians:

- Who follow, believe, trust, have faith and are obedient to the teachings of our Lord Jesus Christ. They have accepted God and shares in making God real to others so that they may experience God's mercy, forgiveness, love and grace.
- Who are self-giving (love) having sacrificial concerns for another person. They take what God gives them (talents) and use them to bring others to Christ.
- Who minister to others that the Gospel may be seen through the life they live and to let others know that there's nothing we can do to earn salvation. We are God's children and our redemption is a gift of (pure) grace, a gift offered without any stipulations and is their duty to inform people of this precious gift. Jesus lived, died, and rose to life to give this precious gift to all mankind.
- Who humbly listen to God and proclaim his message. They are generous, grateful for their gifts and are disciplined to abide by the Word of our Lord Jesus Christ.

However, Jesus final command to his disciples, which includes all believers is, "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations..." (Matt.28:19). This is the mission of all believers to go and make other disciples for Jesus until the end of time. God does not leave you alone, the Holy Spirit guides and direct us to share the grace of God with others. Jesus has called you to serve and has given each of us the implements to do so.




