Pastor's Pen Lenten Transformation

"The Lord Jesus Christ will change our lowly body to be like his glorious body by the power which enables him even to subject all things to himself." (Phil. 3:21b)

As Christian we desire to become Christ like. This transformation is a lifelong process. The Scriptures tell us that Christ will do this work in us. We, however, short-circuit this process by ignoring his will and living for ourselves. This drive to live for ourselves is at the core of our nature,

pervading our minds, our emotions and our will. We would prefer to avoid the process of transformation, live unto ourselves, and rationalize that we are sufficient and able to do most everything. We turn to God only in dire circumstances.

Paul laments over some who have received Christ, but refuse his will for them. He says of them "their god is their belly." They like Esau sell their spiritual birthright for a mess of pottage. He says that they "glory in their shame." They justify themselves, and convince themselves of such unreality, that evil becomes good, and they rejoice in their delusion. He says their minds are set on earthly things, and they lose their relationship to the living God. They are "enemies of the cross." They refuse to deny their natures, and walk with God as he seeks to change them. Their end is destruction.

Just as Jesus yearned to gather Jerusalem under his protection, so he longs to help, heal, nurture, and protect his followers. He likens his desire to care for us to that of a mother hen gathering her chicks under her wings in comfort and security. Will you yield to our Lord as he seeks to transform you into his likeness, or will you cling to your nature against his? Lent is the season of inner change. Let us take advantage of the power it provides.



From the President

During January and February, the church council has been discussing a calendar of events for 2024. The goal of the calendar is to serve as a guide for the year and help us focus on priorities from month to month. By developing the calendar, the council is looking for ways to increase involvement of members by keeping them informed of events in advance and to increase our involvement in the surrounding neighborhood. The council is also looking at what we can do to fill gaps in our programs and ministry. Historically the church has had a strong women's program through the LWML and the women's Tuesday Bible Study. With Covid, the Tuesday Bible Study ceased but the LWML meetings have continued. The council wants to continue to encourage women to participate and grow this organization but would also like to see a corresponding organization for men to form. The men's group would be encouraged to study the Bible together and to do acts or projects that would be pleasing to God. We will hold an initial meeting of a men's group fourth Saturday of April (4/28) at 8:00 AM at the church. A light breakfast will be served and followed by a short Bible study and then a discussion around future plans. Preliminary plans are for the group to meet once a month for breakfast and Bible study and to include a small project around the church or in the community. I hope that all men in the church will participate. Please contact me if you would like any additional information. More details will be published in the April newsletter.

The council is looking at holding events to involve the community. These could include a yard sale, game nights, movie nights, Chrismon craft event, and Christmas caroling. These events would be ones that would involve the whole congregation and also allow us to interact with the community around us in a nonthreatening way. It would also allow us to identify community needs and to contribute resources that could assist with these needs.

Concerning the call process, the voters' assembly on February 4 approved issuing a call to Vicar Andrew Frerichs. Vicar Frerichs will graduate from St. Louis Theological Seminary in the spring. Unfortunately, we have been informed by the seminary that the vicar will not be assigned to us when he graduates. The Call Committee is continuing to review prospective pastors in the field and will bring candidates forward as they are identified. The committee plans to bring a candidate for a call to the voters before Easter and schedule a visit by the called pastor after Easter. The committee continues to look forward to discovering the pastor that God has selected for us.

Paul held up the generosity of the Macedonian churches to those in Corinth (2 Cor. 8). It seemed he desired that they show some kind of

proof of their appreciation of the Lord's blessing and sustaining power to them. He urged them, therefore, to bring to completion the great work begun earlier in their ministry. It seemed apparent they had forgotten, like we often do, with what fervor and fire they had started to serve the Lord. We, too, could use this urging of Paul's periodically. He wanted to bring the churches in Corinth from their relaxed attitude toward giving and sharing and found it necessary to remind them of their oneness in the body of Christ. The Corinthians had begun to take pleasure in what others were doing for God's kingdom and the sustaining of the earthly churches and had forgotten their part. Strive For Equality "Strive for equality," was Paul's urging to the Corinthians. Since Christ bore the total weight of our salvation on himself, could we not at least share in the earthly ministry as a body so that "He who gathers much does not have too much and he who gathered little does not have too little." (2 Cor. 8:15)


Week 5: Guided to Perseverance

Christ Care Ministry Finality's Echo

"It is finished." - John 19:30

Has it ever occurred to you that there is an echo in this very text [John 19:17-30] of Jesus' triumphant cry, "*It is finished*" (v.30)? Look again at verse 22 where Pilate speaks, "*What I have written, I have written.*" In other words, "It is finished. What's done is done. I'm not going to change it." Both statements, that of our Savior and that of the governor, are made with an act of finality.

But what a difference between the echo and the thing echoed. The apparent parallel is actually a contrast. The words of Jesus exude *victory* and *compassion*. The words of Pilate exude stubbornness and sarcasm. The one cry *saves*, the other needles. Jesus is through with His mission. Pilate is through with people.

Let the shoddy finality of Pilate's remark, "What I have written I have written," call to mind the saving finality of Jesus' remark, "It is finished." That way even Pilate's nastiness can serve a wonderful and useful Gospel purpose.

He has risen!




