Pastor's Pen Easter Tears

Jesus said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping?" -John 20:15

I have discovered that my eyes tear up at movies more often than they used to. Perhaps it is that I am just getting older and closer to heaven. Recently I noticed there are three kind of scenes that bring a lump to my throat and make my eyes well up. The first are quite sad, others are actually quite happy, and a third kind is neither sad nor happy, but scenes brimming with nostalgia. My reaction in all three cases suggested that I was more than a distant observer. I was there.



There is a tradition within the church which considers tears to be a gift of God, and the shedding of tears an expression of some of our deepest affections for God --- repentance, longing, joy, love. When something (or someone) touches our lives, deeply enough to cause us to cry; we know that more than our mind is engaged in the relationship. In some way, we have given over our hearts. This was surely the case with Mary Magdalene. Her early morning search for Jesus was driven by a love which could not let him go, even in death. We can only imagine the sorrow which had torn at her soul as she watched her Lord suffer and die (Mark *15:40*). Finding that his tattered body, placed in the tomb so carefully two nights before, was now absent from its resting place, must have broken her heart. Of course she wept. She was no distant observer. Jesus was her life, her love.

We have heard the Easter message probably more times than we can count. The risk of such familiarity, of course, is that the resurrection of Jesus Christ becomes a 'matter-of-fact" announcement. We were not there, nor can we recreate the event no matter how many times it has been scripted and acted. Are we simply distant observers? I think not. This Easter season, let us recall that Jesus has taken over our hearts. Let us remember that we have met this Person, that sometimes we wish he were here by our side, and that we know he is alive. And, if anyone wonders why eyes well up as we hear the Gospel readers proclaim: "Now on the first day of the week," or as we sing: "Jesus Christ is risen today," we can tell them, "Because this is all about my Lord."


Prayer: Dear Jesus, thank you that I am not a distant observer of Easter and for the gift that allows me to express the depth of your love for me. Amen.

Digital Ministry Update. Our digital/virtual ministry of the church continues to expand. At the March meeting of the church council, June Weir shared that the church is active on four virtual platforms: Google Business Page, Facebook, Instagram, and YouTube. All four platforms continue to grow in number of searches, the number of followers, and our total reach. For example, our reach on YouTube is up to 28,500 people while the number of subscribers is up to 154 – a 32% increase from July 2023. Christ Care Ministry The Joyful Parting

"Then He [Jesus] led them out as far as Bethany and lifting up His hands, He blessed them. While He blessed them, **He parted from them** and was carried up into heaven. And they worshiped them and returned to Jerusalem with great joy and were in the temple blessing God.""

-- Luke 24:51-53

We spend a lot of time with "good-byes," don't we? Saying "so long" and "farewell" brings both tears of joy and sadness. It can be so hard to do at times, especially when we experience the loss of a loved one and are left standing, often alone, by a graveside.

But the *parting* Of Jesus - *The Ascension of our Lord* - (Luke 24: 44-53) was not as sad as the words sound. At worst, it was only a physical parting. No longer would the disciples see Jesus in person. But it was not a complete parting or total separation. The above text makes it clear that His guiding, protecting, and empowering presence would be with them as they carried on His mission. Jesus made it even more explicit in Matthew's account, "*And behold, I am with you always, even unto the end of the age"* (Matt. 28:20 ESV). That, beloved, is the Gospel of the ascension, namely that Christ can return to heaven because His implementation of God's salvation plan is finished, and the disciples can herald that plan to the world with Jesus still being with them, even in them (John 14:18, 20), to empower their witness. No wonder the disciples did not grieve at this parting but "*returned to Jerusalem with great joy*" (v.52).

But it will enhance the Gospel of the ascension if we let the words of verse 51, "*he parted from them*." remind us of another parting, that parting which is the very foundation of the Gospel. I refer to the parting of Father from Son at the cross. There Jesus was parted from God. And this parting was every bit as sad (from God's perspective) as the despairing cry of Jesus indicates, "*My God, My God, why hast Thou forsaken Me?*" (Matt. 27:46). The Son, laden with our sins, was indeed parted from His Father. Jesus was damned for us. Here the parting was complete, the separation total.

That's what it took to save us, beloved. That parting at Bethany called the ascension, takes on its full meaning in the light of that parting at Calvary called the damnation. And that's why we can join the disciples in their great joy, praising and blessing God.


