If you have heard me preach before, you will notice that I often talk about trying when it comes to the law. As in, we should try to follow the law of the Lord and do our best to live perfectly. An unobtainable goal but one we should strive for nonetheless. St. Paul says in 1 Corinthians, "Do you not know that in a race all the runners run, but only one receives the prize? So run that you may obtain it." That may sound like works righteousness, but that isn't the point St. Paul is making. He is encouraging the people of Corinth to take their faith seriously. Just as seriously as those who train to win the prize. Run the race. Why? Because God knows

This summer has been a busy one for Lutheran Women in Mission (LWML) as we prayfully selected our new mission projects for this year.

Tradionally, we select an international project, a national project and a lo-



cal project. However, this year we had two outstanding international projects, one sponsored by Pastor George Murdaugh and another sponsored by Tori Presley. Both projects were wonderful opportunities to further the love and compassion of Christ. So, we followed our hearts and selected both—this is the first! We have set a higher goal to support the international and national projects at \$1,000 each and the local project at \$500.

2025 Mission Projects

One Collective: Amanda Epperson will spend 3 years in Zambia specifically working with women. Amanda travels to Zambia this fall where she will be working at the community school mentoring teachers, directing a student scholarship program and teaching Women's Empowerment which includes setting boundaries, grooming, trafficking prevention and awareness, abuse education, and self-defense. Baer Christian Hospital Project, India

In 1909, Dr. Mary Baer, a Lutheran medical missionary to Indian was able to collect funding to begin medical work in a thatched-roofed hospital in Chirala, Andhra Pradesh, India, on the grounds of St. Mark Lutheran Mission. This effort grew into a hospital named the Baer Christian Hospital.

In the 1970s a lack of funding due to missionary withdrawals from the region, neglect from local Christian churches, the convergence of building deterioration and the political climate resulted in Baer Memorial Hospital (BCH) closing its doors, except for a small independent nursing school in the old clinic.

Currently BCH is moving forward with establishing a Nursing College on its campus, 2 (two) Christian medical schools—one in Punjab state and another in Tamal Nadu state—will provide teachers and support staff by extension to the 4-year degreed nursing program.

Please add BCH and the CM&E Trust to your prayers so that work there may continue to reach more people with the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Since work began in Chirala, more than half a million have been served in the name of Jesus Christ. For more information about the CM&E Trust visit:





I was reading a newsletter from First Lutheran Church in Nashville, TN when I noticed the words under the church heading. It read, "Connecting People to Jesus."
