From the President

Dear Members of First Lutheran Church,

On November 2, 2025, the Voter's Assembly approved the Church Council's recommendation to sponsor a capital improvements fundraiser for the church. The heating and cooling systems (HVAC) that service the offices and adjoining hallway, the kitchen, and the library have died. In addition, the Christ Window and the utility building are in need of repair. All of these projects will cost approximately \$50,000 to complete. Due to Federal changes in refrigerant usage for the heating and cooling units that will be enacted on January 1, 2026, the Church Council felt it was in the church's best interest to replace the HVAC units before January 1, 2026.

Donations for the capital improvement projects can be included in weekly offerings or by special gifts. All funds donated for the capital improvement projects should be designated as such when given.

At the Voter's Meeting it was also discussed that due to the expiration of tax credits for the Affordable Care Act, the health insurance cost for the church would be increasing by \$17,478 next year. Please prayerfully consider increasing your offering to the Lord to help cover this expense. Currently the church is breaking even between offerings and expenses but it will not be able to cover the increased cost of health insurance without additional offerings.

We trust in the Lord to provide.

Voter's Meeting Sunday, December 7

A voters meeting is scheduled for December 7, 2025 in the fellowship hall following the worship service. The purpose of this meeting is to discuss and approve a budget for 2026 fiscal year and to discuss and approve an amendment to the church's constitution.



In November at the called voters meeting an amendment was proposed to expand voting rights in the church council. Final approval of this amendment will be sought at the December voters meeting. The amendment is included in the duties of the President and are highlighted in RED below:

1. Duties of Officers

- 1.1 The President of the Congregation
 - 1.1.1 shall be the principal Officer of the Congregation, subject to the direction and control of the Board of Directors.
 - 1.1.2 shall preside over the Congregational Assembly (in accordance with the latest revised edition of Roberts Rules of Order).
 - 1.1.3 preside over the Board of Directors meetings.
 - 1.1.4 shall sign all legal documents with the Secretary, on behalf of the Congregation.
 - 1.1.5 shall enforce the Constitution and Bylaws
 - 1.1.6 shall perform such additional duties as may be directed by the Congregational Assembly from time to time.

1.1.6.1

The President shall have the authority to appoint additional members to serve with the Board of Directors from time to time when it is in the best interest of the church. Together these appointed members and the Board of Directors shall constitute the Church Council. The appointed members shall have equal rights in the Church Council, but they will not assume any of the duties of the Board of Directors.

"It's That Time of Year Again" is a popular quote when the Christmas holidays are approaching. What do we Christians mean when we say, "It's That Time of Year Again."?

We are talking about the season of Advent, the coming of the Christ child. We are preparing for the birth of our Messiah, our Savior, Jesus Christ on Christmas day.






